Administrators' Message

We would like to acknowledge Mi'kmaq Heritage Month and our continued focus on bringing Indigenous learning into our classrooms. We are incredibly fortunate for a second year, to experience Smudging Ceremonies on Thursday, September 28th. Harmony O'Leary (Indigenous Student Support Worker) and her junior leader team, lead us through an educational experience including prayer and the opportunity for personal smudging. Our students were respectful and very engaged! Thank you Ms. Harmony and team.

Our classes will continue to learn and expand on our understanding of Indigenous ways of knowing and learning, as well as, the historical importance of the many contributions of Indigenous peoples, past and present.

On Thursday, October 5th and Friday, October 6th, we will welcome Adams Photography into our building to capture our school photos. Elementary students' photos will take place on Thursday and Junior High will be on Friday.

This month, our grade 6 students will be writing the **Nova Scotia Assessment: Reading, Writing, and Mathematics/Mathématiques.** This assessment will be administered over 4 days in October. Our grade 6 students have been preparing for this assessment.

This assessment includes the following:

- reading and writing tasks that reflect the end of grade 5 curriculum outcome expectations
- reading passages in the narrative, information, poetry/song, and visual text genres
- reading comprehension questions in selected response format
- reading comprehension questions that are designed to provide a broad range of challenge, thereby providing more information about individual student performance
- one letter writing task, and one story writing task
- mathematics questions that reflect the end of grade 5 curriculum outcome expectations
- selected response (multiple choice) mathematics questions in all mathematics domains

Safe Arrival

We continue to use School Messenger for communicating about your child(ren) absences. Information has been shared with families about our safe arrival line 1-833-582-6940 and the website: https://sishrsb.ednet.ns.ca/public/. You can also download the App called SchoolMessenger (Blue Icon). You will need your portal username, or email address you provided to the school. We appreciate your efforts in using our new safe arrival system. If you are calling in for your child follow these steps: select 3 for student attendance; select which student you are calling for. Then you have one of three options: absent for the day, absent for tomorrow, or absent for 3 or more days. Then you will need to choose AWN - Absent with Notification, doing so tells us that you are aware that your child is not in school.

We ask all of our families to complete the Covid-19 checklist for health each morning. If your child shows symptoms and the school contacts you, you will be required to connect with 811.
