Student Success Plan

Short Cycle Planning - 6-8 Weeks, reflect on what works, what did not, where we need to go

Literacy Goal: We will improve achievement in literacy for each of our students, with a specific focus on our students of African and/or Mi'kmaw/Indigenous ancestry.

Math Goal We will improve achievement in mathematics for each of our students, with a specific focus on our students of African and/or Mi'kmaw/Indigenous ancestry.

Elementary – Fact Focus Junior High – Number Sense

Well-Being Goal: We will improve well-being at our school for each of our students, with a specific focus on our students of African and/or Mi'kmaw/Indigenous ancestry.

Food Insecurity

- Students coming to school in mornings and after lunch who haven't eaten, or eaten enough
- Snack program available throughout the day
- Noticing students more regulated throughout the day and especially in afternoons
- Bins in classrooms, Office, some support teachers' spaces, and at Lates Table

HRCE Student Success Survey (grade 4-9) From those findings – Micro survey with our Junior High students – using their answers which allows us to really hear students' voices. We are in the midst of putting focus group together (lunch time/with food), where students have opportunities to talk about how to make school a space place, free of discrimination, what Oxford needs to do to enhance school culture

Future Focus Group – Possibly elementary students – looking at questionnaire around food security, academics, safety

Student voice at SAC (hear their experiences) - invite students some meetings to report back on their focus groups. Suggestion to purchase more books from other cultures in a variety of languages that are reflective of our student population.

SAC Spending

- SAC grant was renewed for the coming year. \$5000 + \$1 per student (481 Students PP-9)
 This was discussed at length, and we will have teachers request items to be covered. We will also encourage teachers to explore grant options as well as suggestions for our well-being goal at the next staff meeting.

 - 4. EAL (P-9) Wireless headphones with microphones Request for 20 headsets @\$28
 - 5. Grade 2/3 Kidney shaped table for small group learning
 - Decision voted to accept all requests, with exception of tabling kidney shaped table until we can get pricing (Sarah Miles to look at Halifax West table costs)
- Also a general discussion on two additional points:
- The fact that the \$5000 number is not indexed (and hasn't been for many years), which is something which could be taken up higher to HRCE.
- The relatively limited facilities and equipment at Oxford school to engage in STEM projects (limited materials, IT equipment, etc.)
